
# Eligibility Criteria for NSF Scholarship:

- The annual family income of applicants should not exceed ₹ 1,50,000.






#### **Scholarship Distribution**



# **Creative Learning**

The Creative Learning Assessment team made significant progress. The Question Bank & Content Vertical expanded its team and successfully converted numerous Non-MCQ questions to MCQs, mapping 67% of Creative And Critical Thinking (CCT) legacy questions. The Product Development Vertical completed most planned sprints, developed cumulative student report dashboards, and integrated new HUM Study features. The Implementation Vertical engaged students from various schools, achieving increased participation despite challenges. Additionally, stakeholder engagement involved collaborations with multiple educational institutions and the introduction of new platforms for teacher and student dashboards



#### **Progress on Question Bank and Content Vertical**

The Question Bank (QB) team made significant progress in enhancing educational assessments by expanding their team and converting over 1,500 non-MCQ questions to MCQs, with further contributions from the USA NSF team and Trivium. They revised frameworks for various subjects and focused on mapping legacy questions, despite challenges like team availability and accuracy. The team, divided among Mathematics, Science, and English, added and mapped thousands of new questions across the CREATIVE AND CRITICAL THINKING (CCT) and HUM Study portals, with notable achievements in both areas, although they faced difficulties with consistency and accuracy in legacy content.

the Question Bank (QB) team has made remarkable progress in advancing educational assessments. The team expanded from 7 to 13 members, with plans to add 9 more. They successfully converted over 1,500 non-MCQ questions to multiple-choice questions (MCQs) and received significant contributions from the USA NSF team and Trivium, adding hundreds of new questions for grades 6 to 8. Despite challenges such as team availability and the accuracy of legacy questions, they added and mapped thousands of new questions across the CREATIVE AND CRITICAL THINKING (CCT) and HUMStudy portals. Frameworks for all subjects were revised, and new drafts were created, ensuring a comprehensive and updated question bank.

# **NCL: Product Development Vertical**

The Product Development Vertical has executed 12 focused sprints aimed at enhancing the North South Foundation-India's educational tools and platforms. Their key achievements include the introduction of new student IDs and learning outcome reports, along with pilot tests for KV schools. Significant integrations of Hum study and Creative And Critical Thinking (CCT) platforms were completed, involving dashboard updates and refinements to learning frameworks. Enhancements to student dashboards, live support for Creative And Critical Thinking (CCT) tests, and the development of progress tracker reports were also notable milestones.


The team developed state and district dashboards for TS Schools, introduced new report formats for OAVS, and improved the Hum study interface. They conducted private school contests and added scenario-based questions to Hum study. Practice tests with multiple filters were introduced, enhancing student preparation. The integration of an equation editor for science assessments and the creation of detailed performance reports marked significant progress.

Key releases included the launch of assessment framework updates for Math, Science, and English, the implementation of a quality control protocol, and the completion of various report changes based on feedback. Comprehensive reports for participation, performance, and ranking were developed for TS Schools and OAVS, with cumulative reports for JNV and KVS also going live. Future plans involve developing teacher portals for worksheet generation and assessment assignments, as well as implementing feedback loops, pending prioritization.

Overall, the Product Development Vertical's efforts have significantly improved the user experience for both students and teachers, ensuring seamless operation and continuous improvement of NSF-India's educational tools.

# **NCL: Implementation Vertical**

The Implementation Vertical has been focused on engaging teachers and schools across various regions, ensuring the seamless execution of educational initiatives from April 2022 to March 2023. The efforts were targeted towards institutions like Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti (NVS), Telangana Social Welfare Residential Educational Institutions Society (TSWREIS), Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS), Odisha Adarsha Vidyalaya Sangathan (OAVS), and Andhra Pradesh Social Welfare Residential Educational Institutions Society (APSWREIS).



# **NCL: Key Insights**

NVS showed consistent participation, with stable teacher engagement and active involvement through regular orientations and report display sessions. In TSWREIS, there was strong teacher engagement through workshops and orientations, although school participation fluctuated due to internet issues and term exams. KVS had participation primarily during specific periods, with regular student registrations and engagement activities, including demonstration sessions. OAVS saw a gradual increase in participation through orientations and student registrations, enhanced by collaboration with Dr. Manoj Das and the Assistant Director. APSWREIS began initial engagement by onboarding two schools, conducting orientation sessions, and facilitating student registrations.

Throughout the year, the Implementation Vertical demonstrated steady growth in engagement and participation across various educational institutions. Consistent efforts in organizing workshops, orientations, and regular engagement activities contributed significantly to this progress.

By focusing on engaging teachers and schools, the Implementation Vertical made notable strides in ensuring the effective execution of educational initiatives.

# **Private Schools BEE Competitions Timeline and Progress**

The Private Schools Competitions witnessed robust engagement from both teachers and students across numerous schools. Throughout the competition, participation remained consistent and steadily increased, with notable growth in the number of registered teachers and schools over time.

Key activities during the competitions included student registrations, the selection of finalists, scoring Spelling Bee answer sheets, and the final distribution of trophies and certificates. An organized and fair competition process was ensured, recognizing and celebrating the efforts of all participants.

Overall, the competitions demonstrated strong participation and engagement, culminating in successful events and the timely distribution of awards. The consistent efforts in organizing and managing the competitions provided a positive and enriching experience for everyone involved. This initiative reflects our commitment to fostering academic excellence and active involvement within our educational community.

Finalists were selected, and spelling bee answer sheets were scored in November.



#### **BEE Competitions 2022 Winners**

Alongside work on the core verticals, significant efforts were made to expand and manage private schools, as well as liaise and communicate with prospective government schools.

#### **Liaising Activities:**

The engagement with JNV (Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti) included mapping all JNVs with UDISE codes and regular coordination with DCs, ACs, principals, and students. TSWREIS (Telangana Social Welfare Residential Educational Institutions Society) involved ongoing meetings and workshops with ICTs and officials. KVS (Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan) focused on student registrations and coordination with principals and coordinators. OAVS (Odisha Adarsha Vidyalaya Sangathan) registered additional schools and maintained active communication with SPD and directors. APSWREIS (Andhra Pradesh Social Welfare Residential Educational Institutions Society) coordinated the registration of Narasayyapalem and Bapatla schools. Private schools engaged in Zoom calls regarding the Spell BEE app and coordinated the distribution of certificates and trophies.

These efforts were made to maintaining strong relationships with both existing and prospective schools, ensuring effective communication and robust participation across all educational initiatives.



Limited funding and resources hindered program implementation and expansion.


Raising awareness and reaching underrepresented communities for scholarship applications is difficult, resulting in fewer applications from these groups.




