Scholarship Program



Eligibility Criteria for NSF Scholarship:


- Applicants must have successfully completed their Class 12 Board Exams.





NCL's progress under the three Workstreams is discussed below:-

Platform Migration

The NCL platform has been successfully migrated to the Azure server.

Load Testing

Load testing for the student interface has been completed. Load testing for QB Admin, School Admin, and Drilldown reports has been initiated.

Product Technology Modifications

Technology modified to facilitate subject-wise and grade-wise assessments. Conducted a 21st-century skills assessment for identifying gifted students at the request of National Institute of Advanced Studies (NIAS).

User Policy Implementation

Partially implemented user policy with restricted access for other users during assessment times.

Collaboration with Khan Academy

Interaction with Khan Academy is in progress for a remedial channel.

Team Enhancement

As approved in the NSF Board meeting on 30.08.2023, the Technology team has been strengthened with three additional human resources focusing on Quality Assurance, Azure Cloud Service Administration, and User Interface/User Experience.

Private School Contest

Organized a contest for private schools and adopted newly added schools.

Sadhana Implementation

Fully implemented Sadhana with all technological facilities. Provided necessary technology support for the analysis of adaptive algorithms, including student test results.

Dashboard Updates

Updated dashboards with modifications to report formats.

Implementation workflow progress



In this academic year, we conducted a total of seven assessments. This was a pivotal year as we implemented curriculum-based, grade-specific assessments for grades VI to X. The duration of these assessments was increased from 60 minutes to 90 minutes to cover Mathematics, English, and Science comprehensively.

Starting with the January 27th Sodhana assessment, we introduced a time limit of 30 minutes per subject to ensure students spend equal time on all three subjects.

Assessment Participation and Performance Overview

The performance and participation levels in the assessments over the past few months have shown significant changes. Below is a summary of these assessments, highlighting key details such as participation numbers and the overall performance of the platform during each event


- o Added 8,405 original questions and 5,850 practice questions.

Contributors

Innovations

Translation Process

Developed a two-step process for translating Mathematics and Science question papers into Telugu and Hindi. This involves initial translation using Google Translator AI, followed by verification and correction by experienced teachers.


Expansion to Grades XI and XII

Assessment Blueprints


Significant effort has been made to develop Assessment Blueprints for grades 6th to 10th this quarter. Blueprints for 11th and 12th grades are currently under development.

Progress Chart




Phase 1

7th and 8th Grade Original & Practise QB Tracking








IMPACT STORIES

Standardized Assessment Format and "Mission 200K" Initiative

- Each assessment will last 90 minutes, with equal time allocated to Science, English, and Mathematics.
- There will be three Sodhana Assessments (Summative Assessments): quarterly, half-yearly, and final.
- We will conduct five to six Sadhana Assessments (Formative Assessments), subject to scheduling.
- All Sadhana Assessments will consist of simple questions.
- Sodhana Assessments will feature more complex, scenario-based questions.
- Starting from the 2024-25 academic year, we are including Grades XI and XII in our assessment program.

Our goal is to increase registrations to 500,000 students and participation to 200,000 students. 
